<p>Components of construction: Paper, polymer and glue. Quantities of listed compounds contained in this product are not reportable under the "Article" exemption, since they do not release or otherwise result in exposure of a hazardous chemical under normal conditions of use.</p>	

SECTION 4	FIRST AID MEASURES
<p><b>INHALATION:</b> Repeated exposures to dusts of this material are not anticipated to result in systemic toxicity or permanent lung injury; however, excessive exposures may cause less severe respiratory effects. If excessive inhalation of dust occurs, remove to fresh air. Dust in throat and nasal passages should clear spontaneously. <p><b>EYES:</b> If dusts generated from fabrication operations get into the eyes, immediately flush eye(s) with plenty of clean potable water for at least 15 minutes while holding eyelids open.
